NOTES

THE KILLING OF SISTER GEORGE was first produced in 1965 at the Duke of York's Theatre, London with Beryl Reid and Eileen Atkins in the leads. It had a very long run and was subsequently made the basis of a film which achieved considerable notoriety by reason of its stress on the Lesbian relationship between June and Childie, which was depicted in some detail. In the play this element is very much a secondary theme and it is a great pity that the film version has affected the play's reputation. Marcus has, in fact, written a comedy with considerable undertones of tragedy and has utilised a situation which is essentially twentieth century - that of an actress in a long-running serial whose fictional character is beginning to invade her private life.

A cut version of the play was previously seen in Moot Hall several years back when the E.15 Acting School visited the Moot House Players Drama Class for a combined session.
