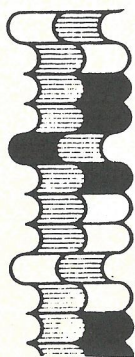

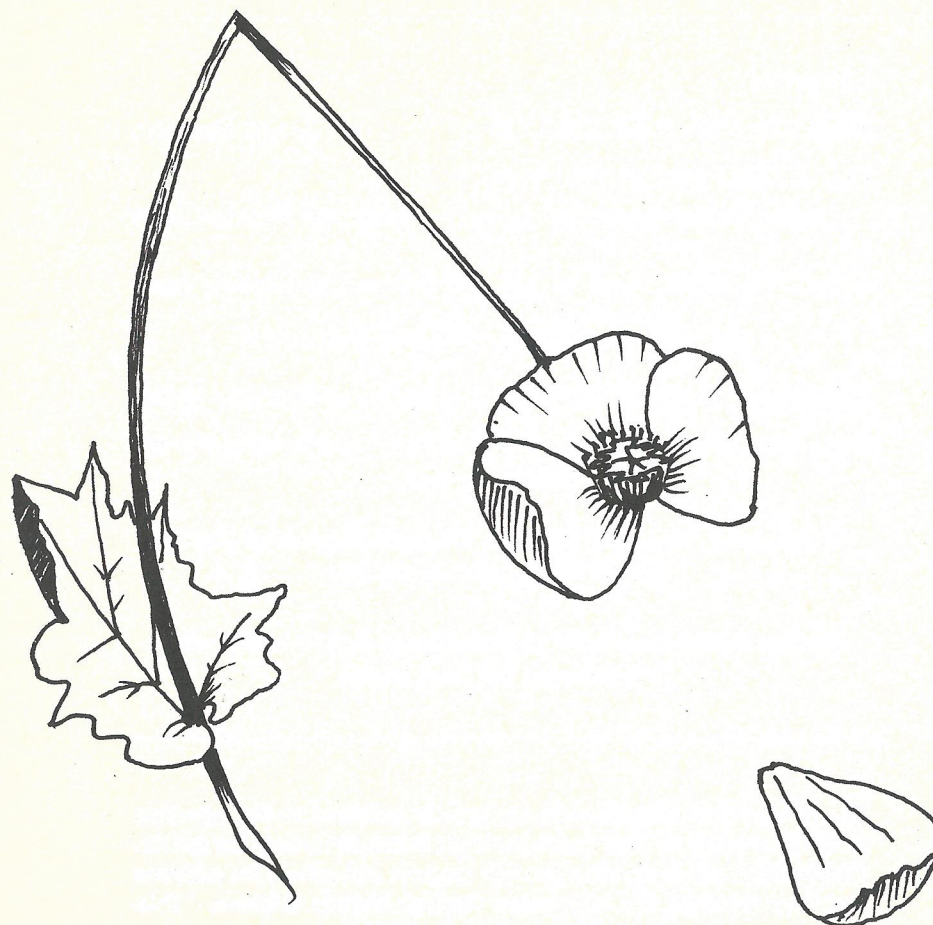

DUET FOR ONE was first performed in 1980 with Frances de la
Tour in the part of Stephanie; it was an immediate success, para-
llels being drawn with Jacqueline du Pre, the eminent 'cellist. In
fact, although the 'story-line' of the piece is concerned with
the devastating effects of multiple sclerosis, the play is concerned
with fundamental aspects of human freedom.

Multiple sclerosis is one of the most tragic diseases known to
medical science; typically it attacks previously healthy young
adults and follows an unpredictable course. It has for years been
the subject of intensive research but so far has resisted success-
fully all attempts to identify its causes or any certain cure.
