

NOTES ON THE PLAY AND ITS AUTHOR

With this production the Players will have performed all three of Brian Clark's major West-end successes. In 1982 they presented WHOSE LIFE IS IT ANYWAY? at Moot Hall and later transferred the production to the Playhouse Studio for a further run. Then in 1989 Moot House Players were awarded the honour of presenting the amateur premiere of THE PETITION, which had been written for Sir John Mills and the late Dame Peggy Ashcroft, and was re-broadcast a few days ago by BBC Radio as a tribute to Dame Peggy.

CAN YOU HEAR ME AT THE BACK? was written in 1979 shortly after Brian had completed his very successful "mid-life crisis" TV series: TELFORD'S CHANGE. His preoccupation with this essentially middle-class concept, coupled with his own experience of living in Harlow New Town in the fifties led to the writing of this play.

We revive the play at a time when there is an increasing interest in the work of architects and a great deal more heart-searching about their role in the environment than there was in the idealistic fifties. But apart from the topicality of the theme, much of the play — as so often is the case with Brian's work — is concerned with the issues of marriage and personal relationships.

Brian Clark performed regularly with Moot House Players, playing many leading parts with them, until he left the town in 1960.

The Players are happy to welcome Leigh Elloway on his first appearance with the company.
